Compiler's Notes 2: The Sons and Grandsons of the Deceased

- The son of the deceased receives the residuals of the estate after the legislated fractions have been distributed.
- When his sister (daughter of the deceased) is present they share that which
 is left with the son receiving twice as much as he daughter
- The grandson (from the son's side) receives the residuals of the estate after the legislated fractions have been distributed.
- When his sister (granddaughter of the deceased) is present they share that which is left with the grandson receiving twice as much as the granddaughter.

Grandson is excluded if the son of the deceased (as he is higher in lineage) is present. Likewise, the great-grandson is excluded if the grandson is alive and so on...
